Areas of practice include alternative dispute resolution (ADR) and divorce services including mediation, child-inclusive mediation (CIM), parenting consulting (PC), and social early neutral evaluations (SENE). Services for complex family systems include coparenting coaching, parent-child relationship repair (PCRR), and family therapy with co-parenting support. Therapeutic services include individual therapy with adults, as well as couples therapy. Neuropsychological testing for ADHD and learning disorders is also provided.

Client populations include families impacted by separation and divorce who are experiencing significant transitions; parents requesting coparenting guidance to better support their children; parents and individuals attempting to resolve disputes through mediation or the PC process; adults and families experiencing mental health disorders and temporary symptoms in response to a significant adjustment in their circumstances; and teenagers and adults seeking accommodations for school, college or work due to concerns related to a suspected ADHD or learning disorders.
